Dear Member,

Thank you for your continued support of USTAG's work. With the return of the Rajapaksas, a climate of fear has returned for Tamils throughout the island. Under Rajapaksa's leadership, the space for dissent has shrunk and self-censorship has grown, while surveillance, militarization, repression and intimidation have been on the rise. Increasing discrimination paired with the country's current vulnerability to endure further human rights violations, has Tamil diasporas all over the world concerned and worried. **But hope has not**

been lost. Our work is more important now than it has ever been and we will continue to tirelessly advocate for peace and justice.

Here is what we have been doing to make a difference.

July & August 2020 Accomplishments

Our advocacy focus these last two months has been to tirelessly inform the highest levels of the US government of Sri Lanka's election results and the dangers it can pose for Tamils back home. We also brought significant awareness to human rights violations against Tamils amidst the containment of COVID-19, Sri Lanka's declining economy, and sentiments of violent Buddhist extremism.

July 25: 1983 July Tamil Massacre Event

We hosted a zoom call with guest speaker Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH) to pay our respects and remember the victims of the July Tamil Massacre. By informing a US Senator about the violence of '83 riots and including youth speakers as well as survivor stories, our event-while mournful- brought a strong semblance of hope for our cause.



July 30: Congressional Caucus on Ethnic and Religious Freedom in Sri Lanka

Our advocacy reached high into the US government when we were in attendance for the Congressional Caucus on Ethnic and Religious Freedom in Sri Lanka. Led by Congressmen Danny Davis (D-IL) and Bill Johnson (R-OH), the Caucus briefing heard from four esteemed panelists who all brought valuable perspectives and accurate information about the troubling events currently occurring in Sri Lanka to the attention of Congress and the Administration.

In order, to continue to push for reform and transitional justice in Sri Lanka, we need reliable people in our government who will understand our issues and help us implement the changes we want to see. It is for this reason that last week we hosted a fundraiser for the reelection of Congressman Bill Johnson, a long time friend of the Tamils who co-chairs the Congressional Caucus for Ethnic and Religious Freedom in Sri Lanka. Our successful fundraiser included three detailed presentations about Sri Lanka's ongoing issues and the danger they pose for Tamils on the island.

To further strengthen our relationships on Capitol Hill we have also helped fundraise for Rep. Tom Malinowski (D-NJ) and expect to host one in Sept. for Rep. Danny Davis (D-IL). We also hope to be hosting a fundraiser for candidates Joe Biden & Kamala Harris. We could use your assistance with all these events.
