concerns and validated the importance of our advocacy to uphold peace, dignity, and fair treatement for Tamils in Sri Lanka.

Joint Statement to Mike Pompeo Ahead of his Visit to Sri Lanka

As many of you know, US
Secretary of State, Mike Pompeo,
has made his way to Sri Lanka this
week primarily in response to the
overwhelming amount of Chinese
influence currently taking place
there. Prior to his visit, various



human rights organizations informed Pompeo through letters of the ongoing violations against human rights currently occurring in Sri Lanka. USTAG, along with five other Tamil diaspora organizations also sent a joint statement to Secretary Pompeo informing him of the decline of democracy in the state and the past gross atrocities which were directly inflicted upon the Tamil people by the current Rajapaksa administration.
